Happy New Year Compatriots!



2nd Lieutenant Commander's Report –

1863 vs. 2013

1863: Emancipation Proclamation goes into effect. Intent was to free slaves and rally support for the war effort (among other intents) Failed miserably.

2013: The black man is still enslaved to drugs, government welfare etc. Blacks are seven times more likely to be in prison than Whites. Blacks are seven times more likely than people of other races to commit murder, and eight times more likely to commit robbery. (Source: *The Color of Crime 2005*)

1863: February 13: President Lincoln is visited by diminutive circus act General Tom Thumb and his wife.

2013: President Obama's administration is a diminutive circus act.

1863: During 1863 and 1864 U.S. officers such as Eleazer Paine, Robert Milroy, Fielding Hurst, and Stephan G. Burbridge made reputations for themselves as butchers by killing civilians without trial and without evidence. These same men adopted as policy the looting of civilian homes, confiscating household goods on behalf of the United States Government as is documented later in this essay. Nathan Bedford Forrest was accused of war crimes at the Battle of Fort Pillow for allowing forces under his command to conduct a massacre upon hundreds of black Union Army and white Southern Unionist prisoners. Union Major General William T. Sherman investigated the allegations and did not charge Forrest with any improprieties.

2013: The Duval County (Fla.) school board voted 7-0 Monday to change the name of Nathan B. Forrest High School after the current school year ends.

1863: Ambrose Burnside issued General Order 38 in which he stated "anyone found guilty of committing acts for the benefit of the enemies of our country will be subject to execution." Ambrose Burnside orders the Chicago Times to close because of the paper's anti-Lincoln rhetoric.

In a rally intended to be a reaction to Burnside's General Order 38, Clement Vallandigham criticizes Abraham Lincoln for not ending the Civil War, which he characterized as "wicked and cruel."

Former representative and a leader of the Peace Democrats, Clemont Vallandigham is arrested by the federal army.

2013: Obama's Truth Squads facilitate partisans to snitch to the government about people exercising their free speech to criticize Obama Administration policies. Obama partisans label the Tea Party participants as terrorists for exercising free speech.

1863: "Stainless Banner" becomes the second Confederate Flag

2013: The Confederate battle flag continues to stir up controversy in high schools in both the US and abroad as teenagers who display the flag as a symbol of pride in their heritage and traditional values are being told by school administrators that it is in reality nothing more than a symbol of hatred.
